
MOTION TO DISQUALIFY
ATTORNEY GENERAL FROM
PARTICIPATION IN GRAND JURY
INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION
PURSUANT TO SC CODE SECTION 14-7-1650 (C)

Robert W. Harrell, Jr., by and through his undersigned attorneys hereby moves the court for an order disqualifying Attorney General Alan Wilson from participation in any state Grand Jury investigation and prosecution of Robert W. Harrell, Jr.

Said motion is made upon the ground that, upon information and belief a state Grand Jury investigation is ongoing as to certain activities of Robert Harrell and in connection therewith the Attorney General of South Carolina should be disqualified. In support of this motion, see the attached affidavit showing a conflict requiring disqualification. Counsel would request an in-camera hearing to consider this affidavit and other reasons that may be propounded at such a hearing.



mentioned at the Subcommittee meeting. The AG indicated that he was strongly in favor of establishing a PIU which would be under the auspices of the Attorney General's office.

AG Wilson stated that the PIU was his number one priority this session. He stated that he was talking to me about this because he could not talk directly to Speaker Harrell because of the ongoing investigation of the Speaker. He stated that he fully expected me to repeat everything that I could remember about our conversation back to the Speaker.


At one point he pounded his fist on his desk. I felt intimidated. It was clear to me that the AG wanted the Speaker to support the PIU and that there would be consequences if the Speaker did not, and that AG Wilson felt he was giving Speaker Harrell a chance to support the PIU. AG Wilson used the term "olive branch" at least twice. In closing, the AG gave me his card with his contact information and insisted that I get back with him, or with one of two specified aides to the AG, the next day to let him know whether the Speaker was supportive of the PIU being included in the bill. He was adamant that I let them know the Speaker's response before the Committee meeting the next day.

After consultations with the Speaker, I called one of the designated aides the next morning prior to the Committee meeting and told him the Speaker would support the PIU.
