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Conservative S.C. voters back Scott ahead of 2016 race

Raleigh, N.C. – Barring the emergence of a surprise challenger, newly elected U.S. Senator Tim Scott will have a smooth road to winning his first full term in 2016.

Scott leads all potential Democratic opponents by at least 22 points in head-to-head matchups. Most importantly, however, he has secured the support of very conservative voters at 78% approval, a crucial endorsement in hyper-conservative South Carolina, where Republican primaries are often more hotly contested than general elections.

Fellow Republican Gov. Nikki Haley is also well-liked at 51% approval among the general electorate, though her proposal to raise the gas tax 10 cents is highly unpopular. A strong majority (69/20) opposes the measure. When couched strictly as a means to raise funds to repair the state's roads, it is still rejected by a wide margin at 55/32. Democrats and Republicans equally oppose the tax, 62% and 71%, respectively. Casinos are the more preferred route for funding the state's road infrastructure, topping raising the gas tax 58/26 when compared vis-à-vis.

“South Carolina may be a Republican state,” said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. “But voters like the Democrats’ idea of paying for road repairs with proceeds from opening casinos a lot more than they like Nikki Haley’s of raising the gas tax.”

Voters are divided on the long-standing issue of flying the Confederate flag in the state capital. South Carolinians support continuing to hang the flag at the State House by a 10-point margin, 50/40. 71% of Republicans are in favor of flying the flag, and 52% believe it is good for the state’s image. There are signs that South Carolina is able to suspend its penchant for conservative polemic, however. A majority—60%—says that the recent legalization of gay marriage in the state has had no impact on their lives. A recent proposal in the state legislature to strip gun rights from those convicted of domestic violence draws significant support. 76% of voters endorse preventing domestic violence perpetrators from acquiring guns, and 64% support requiring them to turn in any guns they currently own.

PPP surveyed 868 registered South Carolina voters from February 12th to 15th. The margin of error for the survey is +/- 3.3%. 80% of interviews for the poll were conducted over the phone with 20% interviewed over the internet to reach respondents who don’t have landline telephones.
