I am writing to affirm that the Moore School takes academic integrity seriously and I am asking each of you to do the same – to uphold the Carolinian Creed and the UofSC Honor Code policy.

As we approach finals and the end of the semester, we would like to remind you of the consequences of honor code violations. Honor code violations may:

- result in probation, suspension, or expulsion.
- lead to an *F* in the course causing a student's GPA to fall below the GPA required for progression, retention, or graduation.
- lead to notation on a student's transcript.

Please also be aware that:

- students are expected to report suspected honor code violations to faculty or the Office of Academic Integrity.
