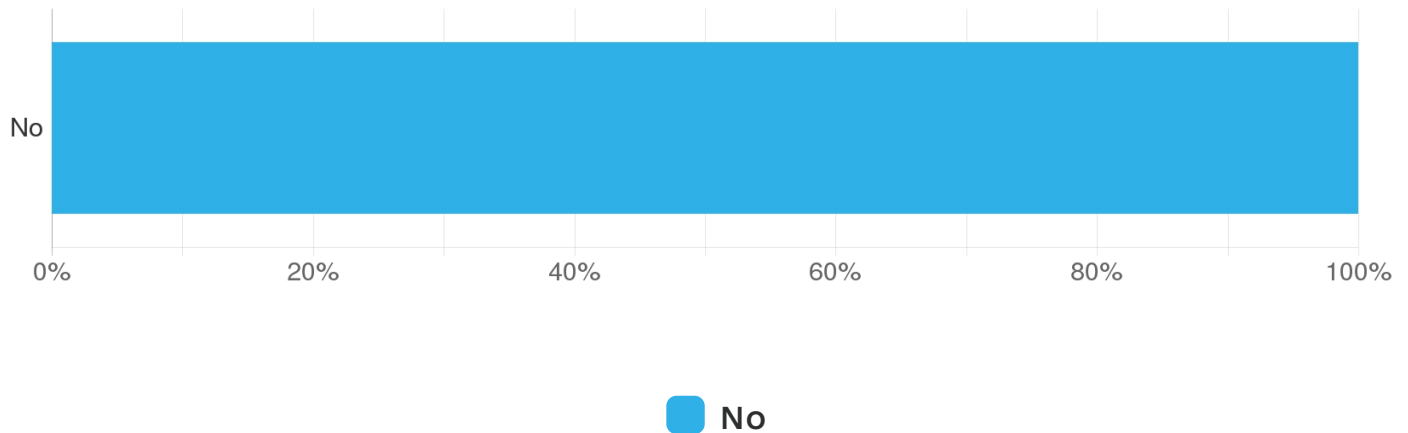
The SC CD 01 General Election Survey was conducted by IVR and Online to Mobile Interviews from May 15 - May 18 among a random sample of 500 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

First, are you or any member of your immediate family a member of the news media, a Public Relations company, or an active participant with any political campaign?



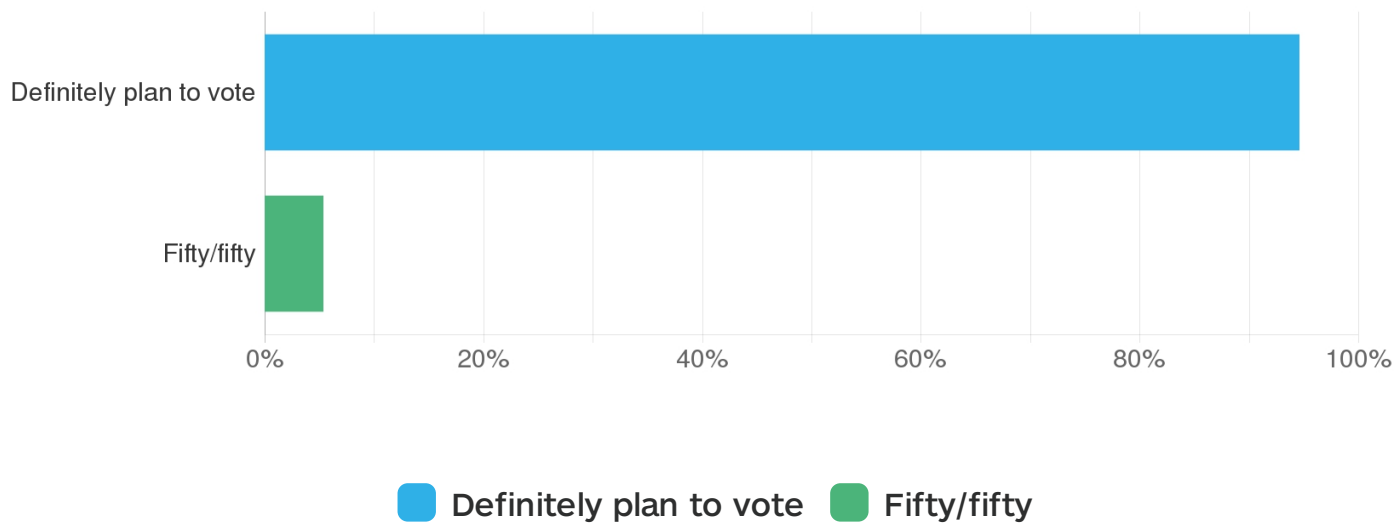

Thinking about the 2020 election for United States President, Congress, and various state and local offices, do you plan to vote in this election?



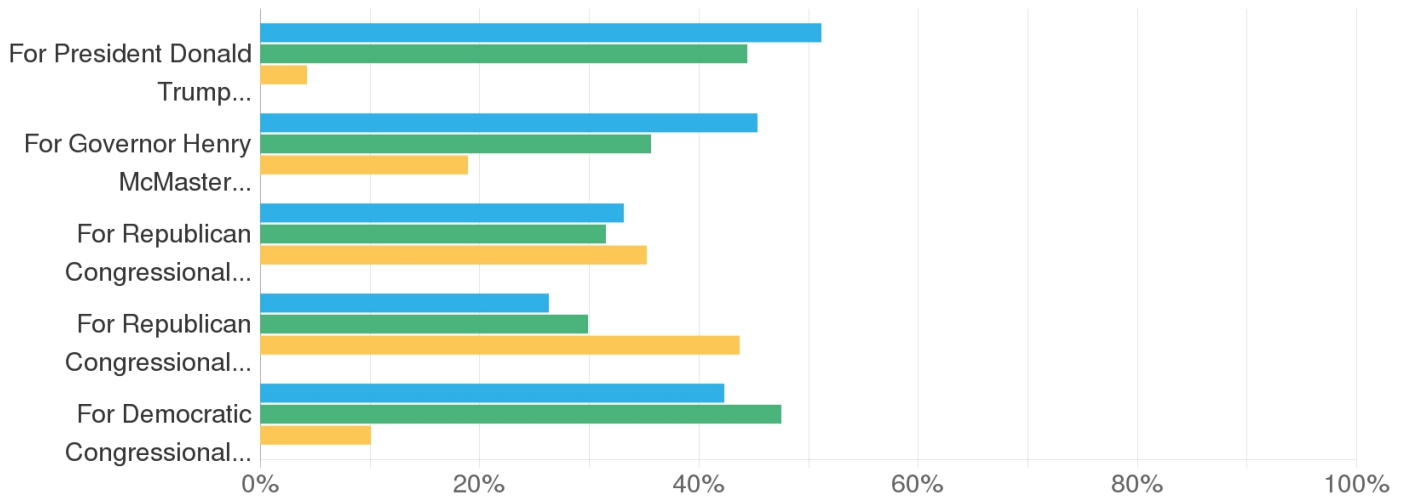

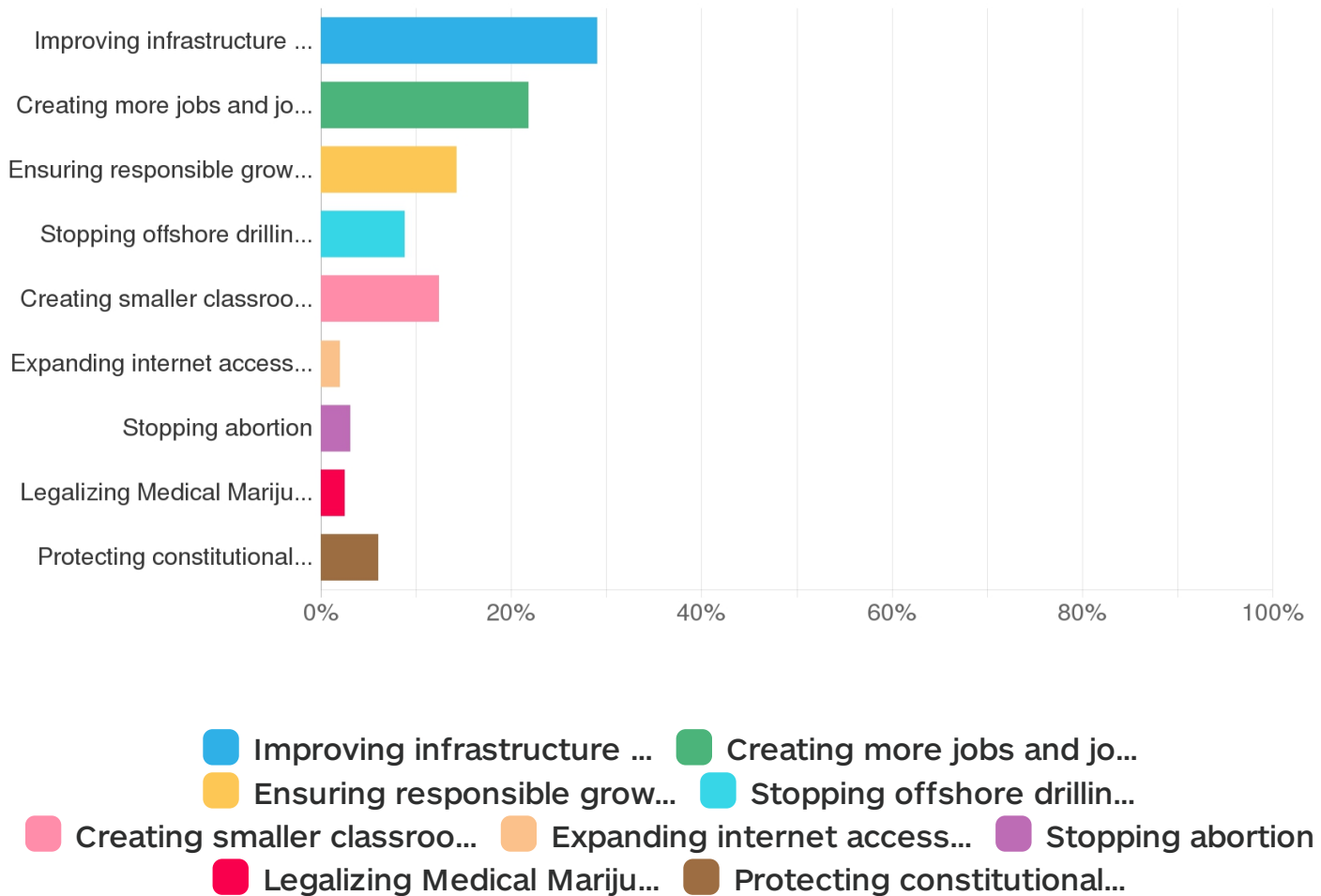

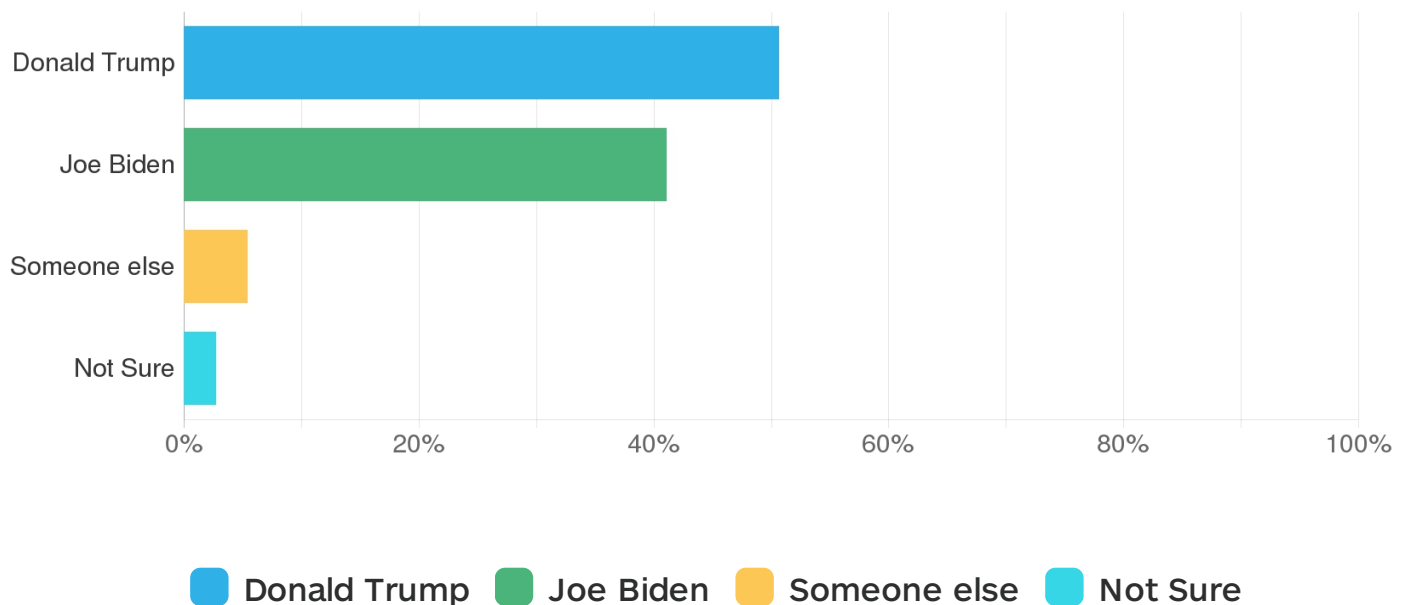

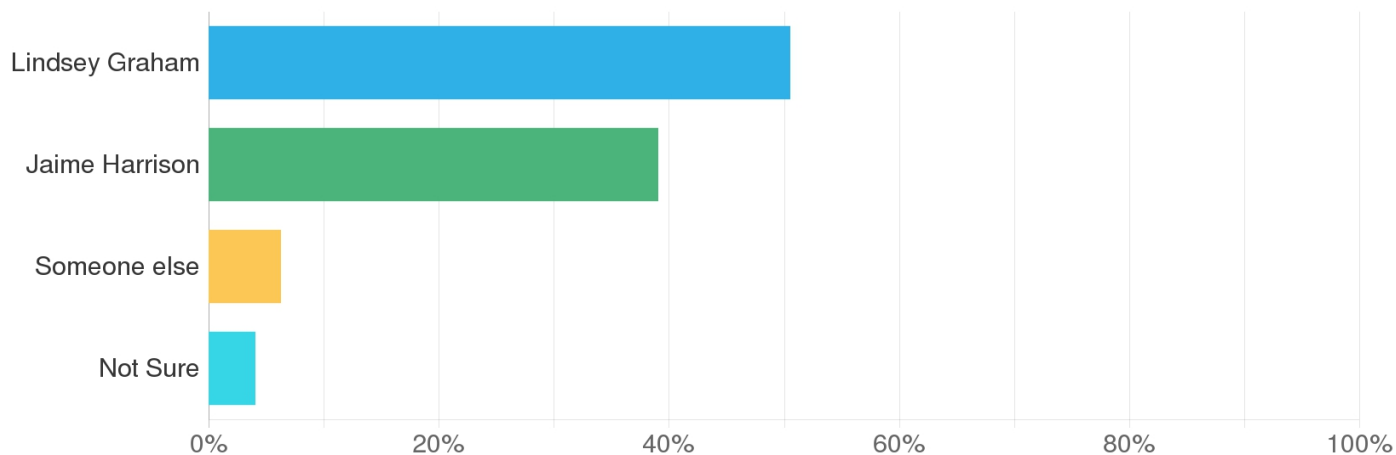

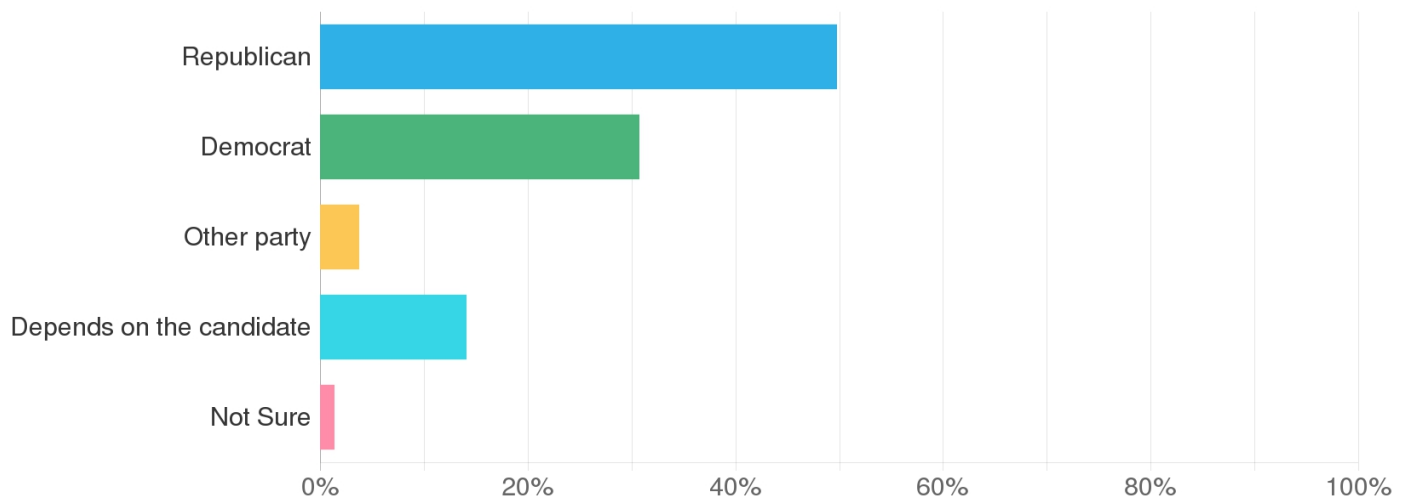

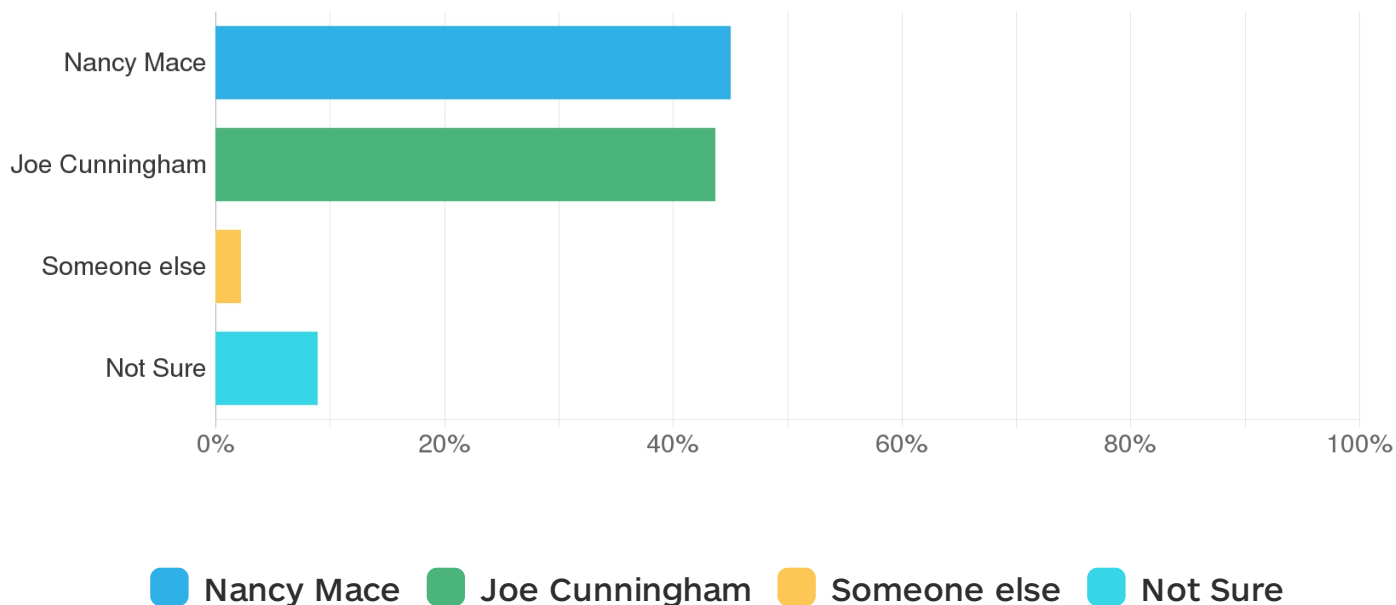

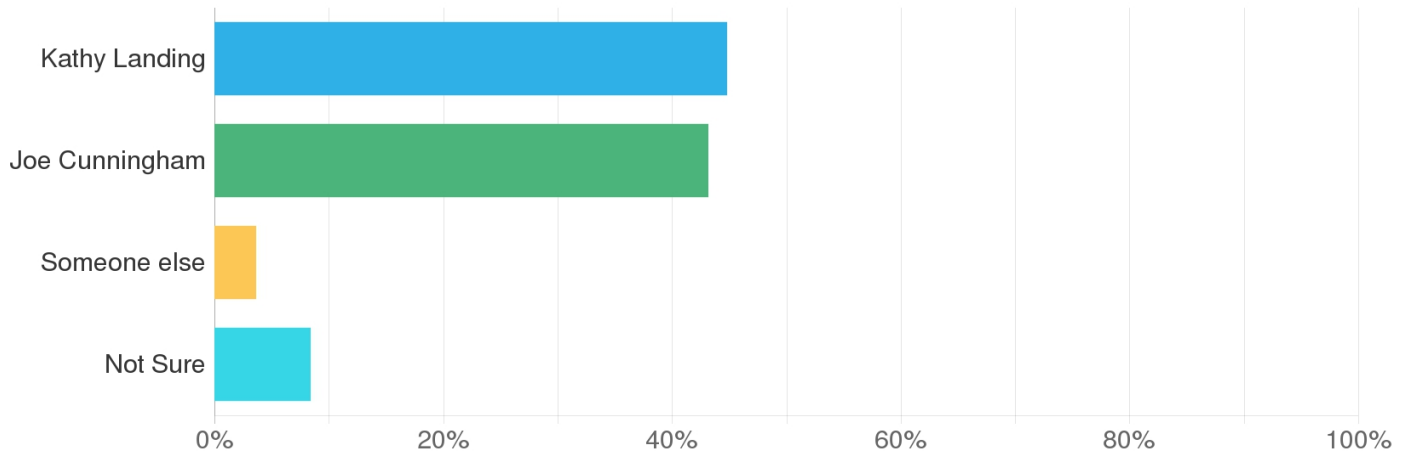

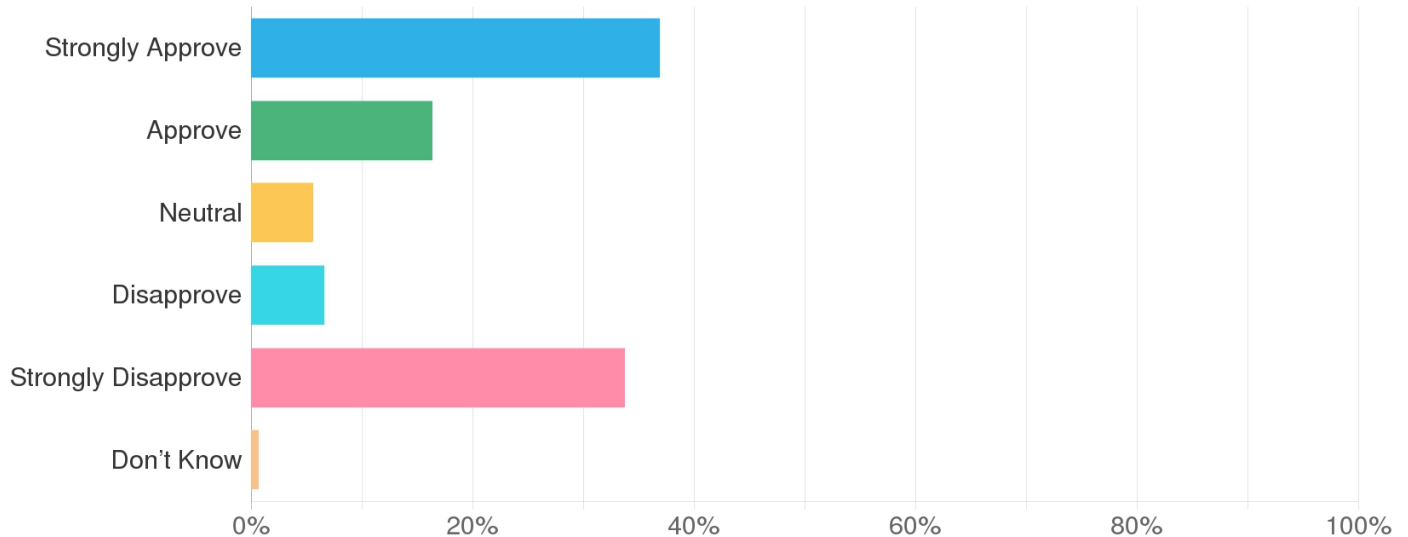

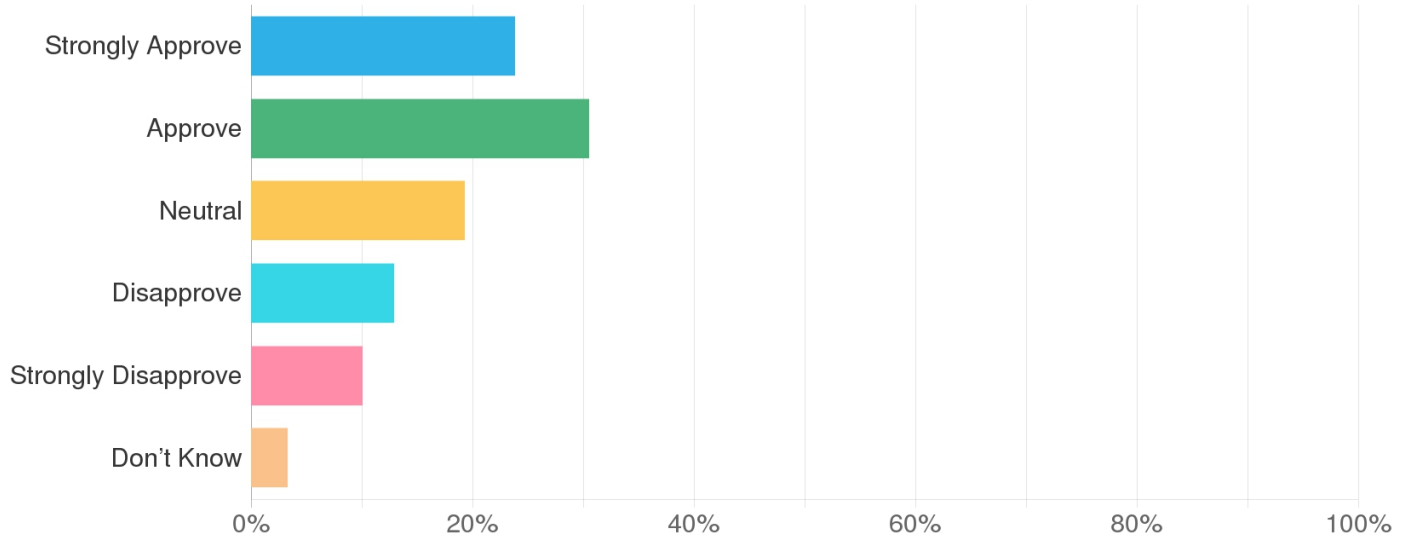

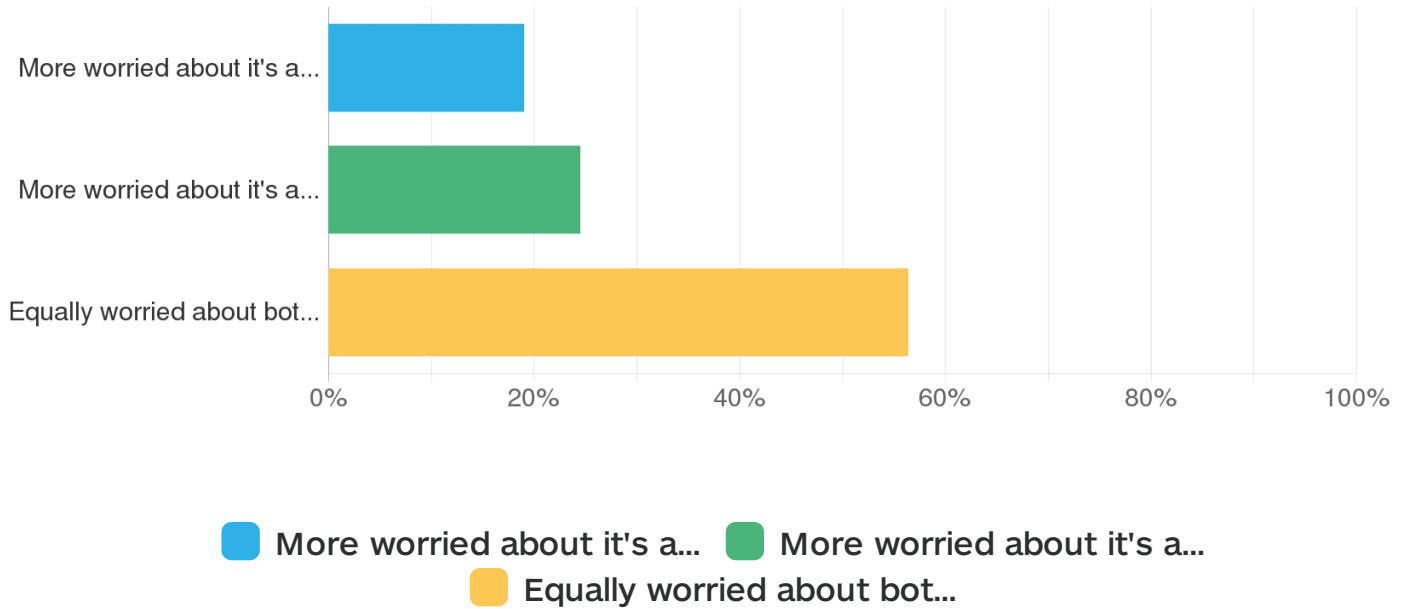

When thinking about the threat of COVID-19, would you say you are...



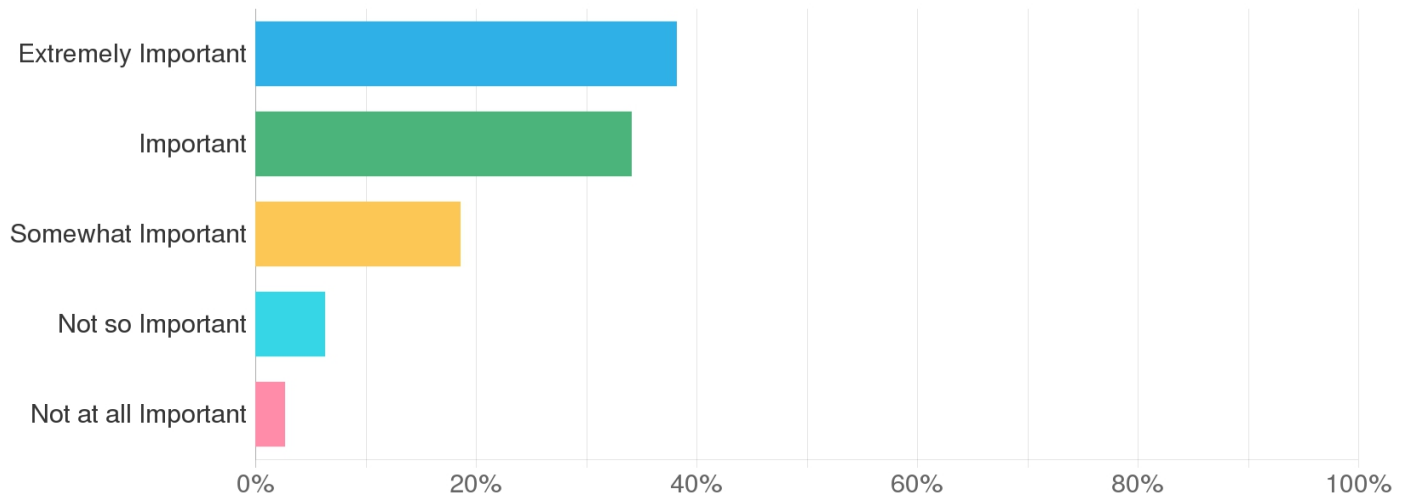

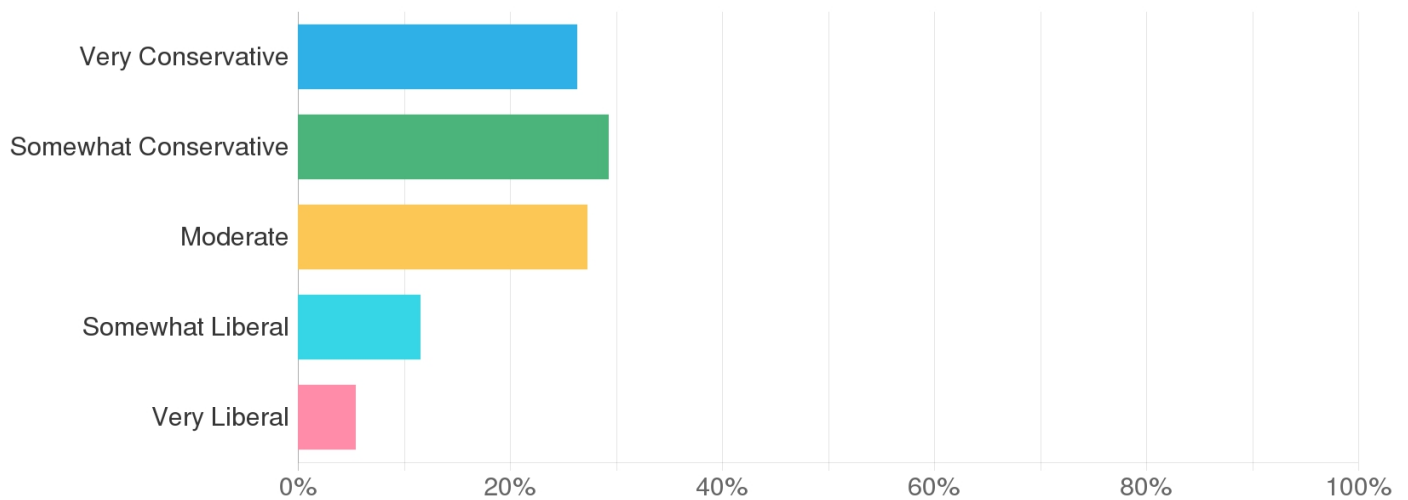

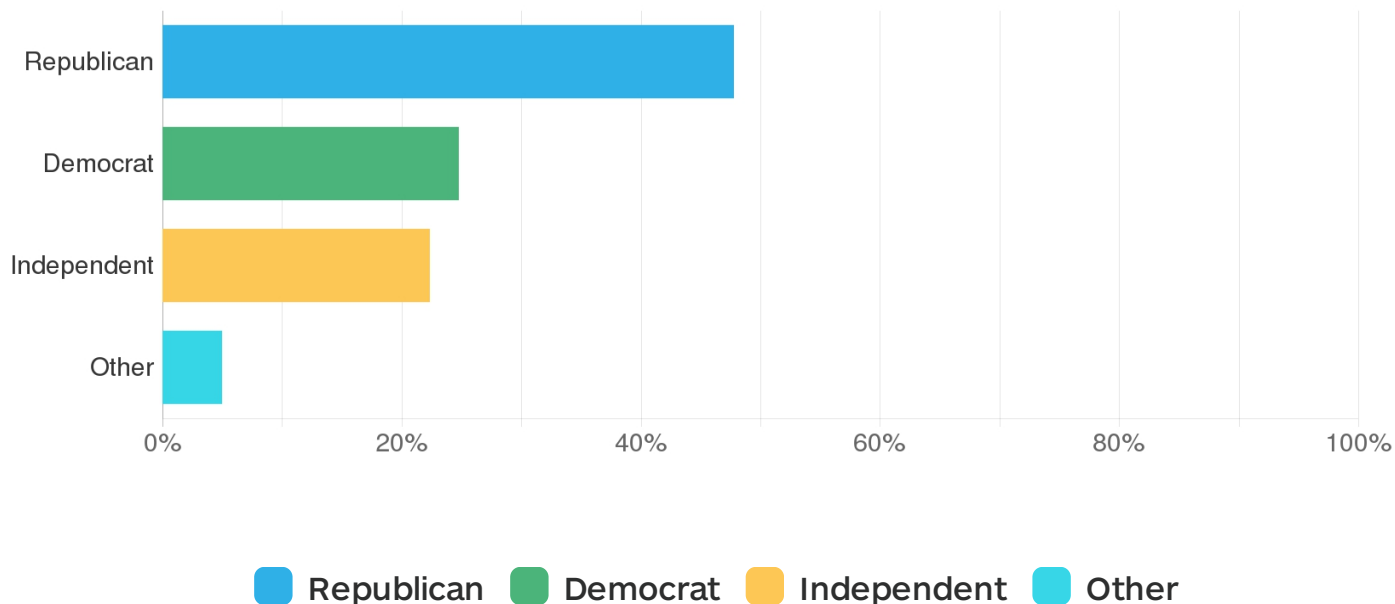

If you had to choose, which of these comes closest to how you would describe yourself politically?



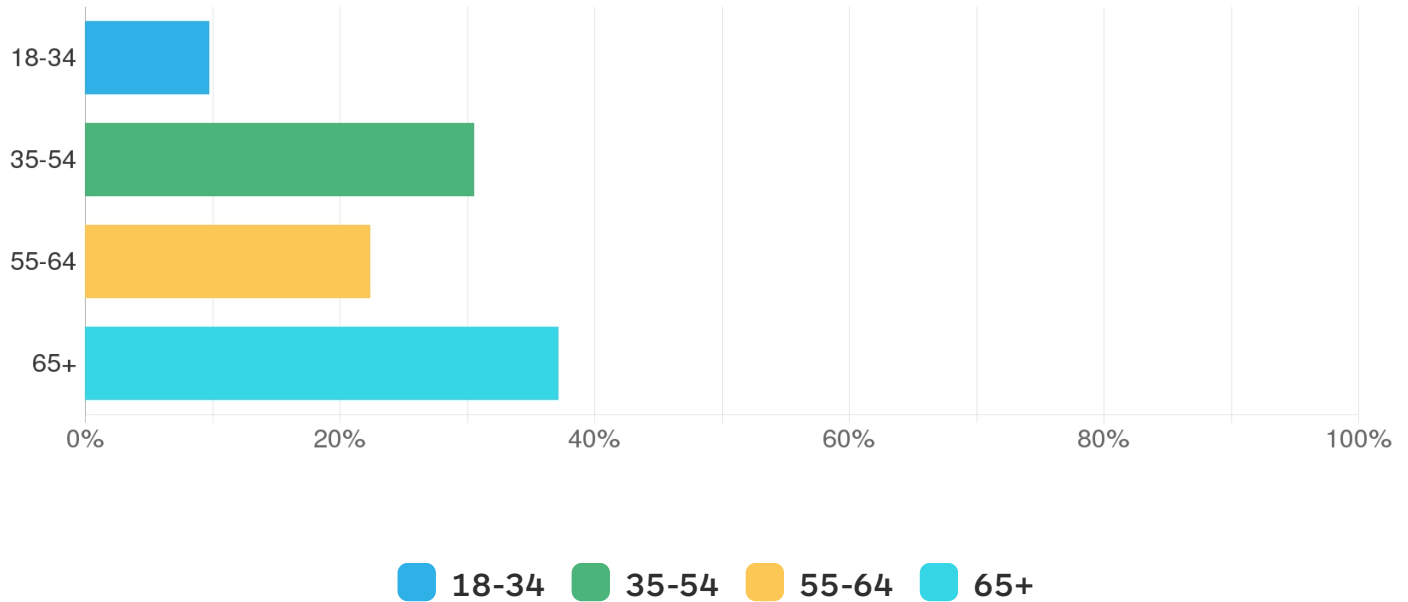

What is your age?



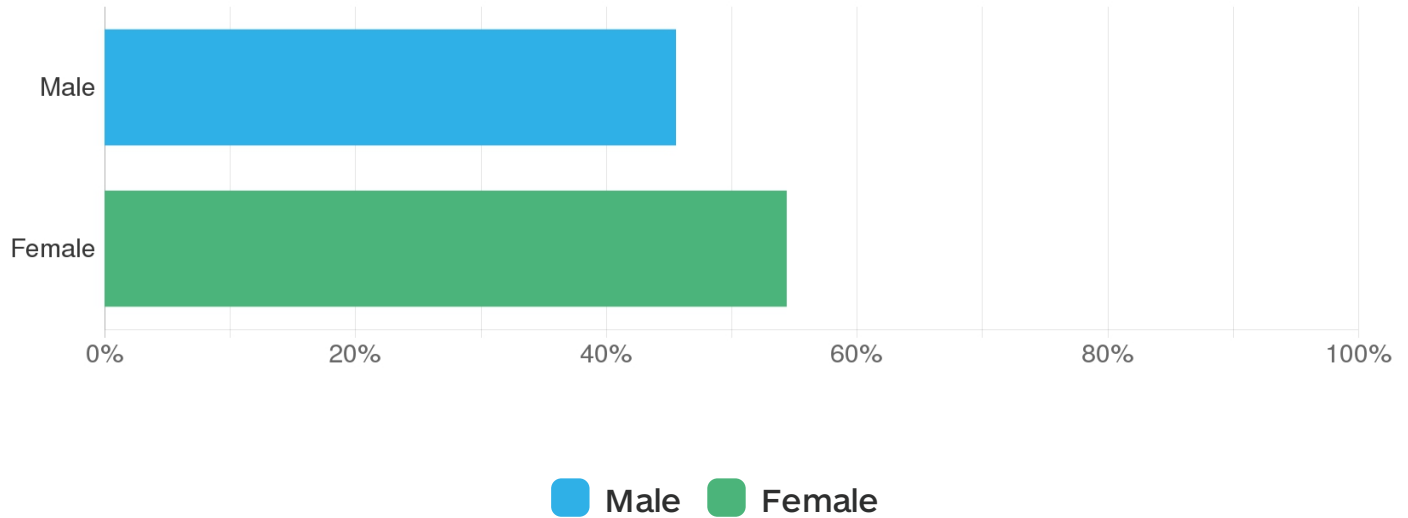
