



victim was also present at the hearing and indicated she is afraid of the Defendant and does not wish for him to be released.

After hearing the arguments of counsel and considering the factors set forth in S.C. Code Ann. § 17-15-30 (Supp. 2021), this Court finds that the Defendant's bond should be reinstated. However, due to the serious nature of the charge, this Court finds that in the event the Defendant is released, his bond is hereby modified and he is to be under home detention pursuant to S.C Code Ann. § 24-13-1530 (2007) with GPS monitoring to be installed prior to his release. The Defendant shall provide a current address upon release. The Defendant shall not depart his residence except for the following reasons:

- (1) hours in employment or traveling to or from employment;
- (2) time seeking employment;
- (3) medical, psychiatric, mental health treatment, counseling, or other treatment programs;
- (4) attendance at an educational institution;
- (5) attendance at a regularly scheduled religious service at a place of worship; or
- (6) legal appointments and required court appearances.

Further, the Defendant shall have no contact with the victim and must continue mental health treatment at Waccamaw Mental Health. Finally, the home detention conditions shall be zero tolerance for noncompliance. The GPS monitoring company and bondsman shall notify the State of any noncompliance with the conditions contained herein and upon receiving notice of noncompliance with the home detention conditions, law enforcement is authorized to immediately take the Defendant into custody pending a hearing. ***Failure on the part of the GPS monitoring company and bondsman to properly monitor the Defendant or to promptly notify the State of a***

*violation shall subject the GPS monitoring company and bondsman to criminal contempt proceedings before this Court.*

**THEREFORE**, it is the Order of this court that the Defendant's motion to reinstate bond is hereby granted and modified as set forth above.
