	On the above date and time, I PTL Parker, was patrolling the area of Palm Blvd and the IOP Connector, Isle of Palms, SC. I started patrolling outbound on the IOP Connector when I noticed a dark in color Mercedes SUV (SC MZX905) inbound on the IOP Connector with his high beams on within 200 feet of the vehicle in front of me and my vehicle. I turned around when safe and started to follow the SUV. The SUV crossed over the white fog line while it was inbound on the IOP Connector, Isle of Palms, SC. The SUV then started to make a right-hand turn onto Palm Blvd from the IOP Connector at the intersection of Palm Blvd and 14th Ave, Isle of Palms, SC. Once on Palm Blvd, the SUV further failed to signal a lane change from lane 1 to 2. I initiated a traffic stop by activating my blue lights ending at Palm Blvd and 10th Ave, Isle of Palms, SC. I approached the vehicle from the driverside and made contact with the driver (subject 1). I informed subject 1 of the reason for the stop and introduced myself as an police officer with IOPPD. Upon talking to subject 1, I immediately smelled the overwhelming scent of an alcoholic beverage coming from subject 1's breath. Subject 1 was also slurring his speech and when I asked how much he had to drink, he did not answer the question and just stated that he was coming from seeing his son and grandson in MT Pleasant, SC. I called for an additional unit, and when SGT Mobley arrived on scene, I positioned																					
	the vehicle to create a safety lane for SFSTs and extinguished all forward facing lights. I explained to subject 1 that I was asking him to conduct SFSTs to see if he was ok to drive, and then I asked the driver to step from the vehicle to which he complied. It is to be noted that the driver just kept on saying "why are we doing this". I asked him to rate his sobriety on a scale of 0 (sober) to 10 (drunk) and he elected not to answer. I placed him into position for the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test. I then asked subject 1 if he had any medical conditions or if he took any medication, to which he stated he did not. I asked if he wore contact lenses or eyeglasses to which he replied contacts. I then asked if they were hard or soft, with him replying soft. I then explained the instructions and then began the test, with the following being noted:																					
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HGN (6/6):
Equal pupil size
No resting nystagmus in either eye
Equal tracking
Lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes

Lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes Distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes

Onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes

Vertical gaze nystagmus was also noted in one eye

Subject 1 had to reminded multiple times to not move his head. He persisted to try and move his head the whole test. I also observed subject 1 to have a noticeable front-to-back sway and increasingly strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath and person.

I then placed subject 1 into position for the Walk and Turn and explained and demonstrated the test.

The driver stated he understood and the following was noted during the demonstration and performance:

WAT (7/8):
Started too soon
Unable to maintain balance
Stepped off line
Improper turn
Missed heel to toe
Used arms for balance
Stopped during the test

Subject 1 got argumentative during the first explanation of the test. He appeared at first to not want to take the test anymore stating that he did not know where this was going and what the outcome would be. SGT Mobley and I explained the reason for the test and he elected to continue, despite saying he had hip issues. Subject 1 performed the test after a second explanation and demonstration, but appeared to just walk the test normally instead of on the line.

I then placed the driver into position for the One Leg Stand test and explained and demonstrated the test, confirming he understood. The following was noted during the performance:

OLS (2/4): Used arms for balance Put foot down

The driver put his foot down and kept asking if he should continue.

I then placed subject 1 into position for the Lack of Convergence test. I instructed him to not move his head and to follow my finger with his eyes only. Subject 1's eyes did not converge, with his left eye looking straight and the right crossing onto my finger. I then kept subject 1 in the same position for the Modified Romberg test. I explained and demonstrated the test instructing him to imagine 30 seconds, and when he thought 30 seconds had passed to look forward. SGT Mobley instructed me that he did it in 16 seconds. Lastly, I placed subject 1 into position for the Finger to Nose test. I explained and demonstrated the test with subject 1 not placing his finger onto the tip of his nose. Subject 1 kept touching approximately a half inch away from the tip of the nose all around for the six attempts.

I determined subject 1 was materially and appreciably impaired, so I placed him under arrest. I placed him into handcuffs which were checked for fit and double locked for safety. I then searched his person incident to arrest with nothing of evidentiary value being found. I then advised him of his Miranda warnings to which he stated he understood. He was placed into the rear, secure compartment of my marked patrol car 515 with seatbelt being applied. My rear compartment was searched prior to placing him in the back. I transported him to IOPPD HQ for breath testing. I secured my weapons in my trunk and escorted him upstairs to the DMT room. I secured subject 1 to the DMT table and activated the recording system for the DMT. I printed and read to him

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the Advisement of Implied Consent Rights to which he stated he understood. I put his information into the DMT system and awaited the 20 minute waiting period. When a breath sample was requested by subject 1, he decided to not blow and it was marked as a refusal. The test results were printed, explained, and filled out. A Notice of Suspension was filled and completed. Subject 1 did not sign any paperwork.

I escorted subject 1 back to my marked patrol car, 515, and seatbelted him into the rear secure compartment. I transported him to ACDC where he was booked and lodged without further incident. Handcuffs were removed after correctional officers searched him.
