On the morning of May 18, 2007 Pfc. Lamparter and Cpl. Eliason of the Horry County Police Department responded to 2 [REDACTED] Tibton Circle in the Socastee section of Horry County in reference to a white male lying in roadway and possibly stabbed. Upon arrival they observed a deceased white male lying in the roadway, he appeared to have been stabbed. They made contact with the original complainant, [REDACTED] who found the victim while delivering newspapers for The Sun News. Lamparter and Eliason secured the scene and requested the presence of a Violent Crime Detective.

Detective Todd F. Cox of the Horry County Police Department – Violent Crime Section responded to the scene, as did Crime Scene Investigator (CSI) Robert Deal. Deal and Cox were briefed by patrol units and conducted a walk-through of the scene while wearing protective foot covering. The victim was observed to be a white male laying in a supine position on the side of the road in front of [REDACTED] Tibton Circle. He was wearing a pair of blue jeans, a sock on his left foot, and a gold colored necklace around his neck. The victim displayed what appeared to be multiple puncture wounds to the anterior side of his torso. A black handled knife was on the ground beside his right leg, it was in the open position.

CSI Deal photographed and processed the scene. In doing so he collected several items of evidentiary value to include swabs from the knife, blood swabs from the roadway, blood swabs from the mailbox, \$1009.53 US currency from the victim's pants pockets, a clear baggy containing suspected cocaine from the victim's left pocket, and a glass vial containing suspected cocaine from the victim's right pants pocket.

Detective Scott Bogart of the Horry County Police Department – Violent Crime Section responded to the scene and interviewed one [REDACTED] who had found the victim and called 911. [REDACTED] stated that he was delivering The Sun News when he observed the victim lying in the roadway. [REDACTED] observed no other people or vehicles moving in the vicinity at that time. [REDACTED] statement was recorded on audiotape for future reference. Detective Bogart examined [REDACTED] hands, arms, and clothing and found no evidence that [REDACTED] was involved in the death of the victim.

Detective Bogart, Detective Allen Large, and Detective Steven Clark canvassed the residences in immediate proximity to the victim and located no one who heard or saw anything suspicious during the night.

Detective Clark subsequently made contact with [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] advised that one of their friends was missing. Detective Clark showed them a photo of the deceased, at which time he was identified as one Michael Vieira. Consent to search the [REDACTED] residence was obtained from [REDACTED]. Crime Scene Supervisor Peter Cestare processed the residence and located no evidence associated with Vieira's death.

[REDACTED] voluntarily traveled to the Horry County Police Department, where they were interviewed. The interviews revealed that the victim had used cocaine and LSD on the night in question. The victim began acting violent and irrational after taking the LSD. [REDACTED] spoke with the victim's wife ([REDACTED]) by phone at that time. She recommended that they let the victim "walk it off", at which time the victim walked out the front door of the residence. They did not see or hear from the victim again after that point. All statements were recorded for future reference.

Detective Cox and Detective Bogart met with [REDACTED] at her residence on the afternoon of May 18, 2007. She provided a voluntary, tape-recorded statement in which


she advised that the victim had one to Myrtle Beach on May 17, 2007 with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] for the Harley-Davidson rally; they were to stay with [REDACTED]. She acknowledged suggesting that Michael "walk-off" his inebriation on the night in question. She further advised that the victim used cocaine on occasion, but she had never known him to use LSD. [REDACTED] was subsequently shown photographs of the knife found beside the victim; both times she indicated that he owned a knife that appeared similar.

Dr. Edward Proctor performed an autopsy on the victim at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center on May 18, 2007. Dr. Proctor identified twenty-six puncture wounds to the victim's chest and abdomen. All of the wounds measured 2.5 to 3 centimeters with edges opposed, all angled right to left and superior, and no hilt marks were observed. Five of the wounds penetrated the thoracic cavity, lacerating the heart and left lung. The victim displayed no defensive injuries or other evidence of trauma. A urine drug screen conducted at Grand Strand Regional medical Center on that date was positive for cocaine and THC. Blood was retained and forwarded to National Medical Services for toxicologic analysis. That evaluation revealed a blood ethanol level of 51 mg/dL, and a positive drug screen for cocaine, cocaine degradation product, marijuana, marijuana metabolite, and LSD. Dr. Proctor completed an autopsy report documenting his findings. He concluded that the victim died as the result of multiple stab wounds to the chest and abdomen, which caused massive hemorrhaging.


Swabs from the knife handle, knife blade, knife internal blade housing, roadway beside the victim, and mailbox beside the victim were forwarded to SLED for DNA analysis, as was a blood standard from the victim. On July 24, 2007 Detective Cox received a report completed by SLED Forensic Scientist Catherine Leisy. Said report showed that DNA profiles were developed from the swabs submitted and were found to match the victim. The report further stated, "The probability of randomly selecting an unrelated individual having a DNA profile matching these items is approximately 1 in 1 quintillion".

The investigation into the death of Michael Vieira has revealed no evidence of foul play on the part of anyone other than the victim. At the time of his death, the victim

was under the influence of a hallucinogen (LSD) and other drugs. As a result, the manner of death is best classified as Accidental; the investigation is closed accordingly.

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

Michael Viera (Deceased)

In June of 2009 the Behavioral Science Unit undertook an Equivocal Death Analysis of the death of Michael Viera, who died on 05/18/2007. This was at the request of the deceased's mother, [REDACTED] with the approval of your department.

It is our opinion that the injuries the deceased sustained that caused his death were self inflicted due to LDS intoxication as originally reported by your investigation and the Coroner.

We were able to identify the supplier of the LSD, a [REDACTED], who died of a drug overdose in Charleston County on 10/16/2008. The 15th Circuit Solicitor's Office declined to prosecute the witness of the sale, [REDACTED] due to insufficient evidence. As a result the BSU will take no further action in this matter.



NOTIFICATION/ INCIDENT DETAILS:

On the 18th day of May 2007 at 0545 hours I was notified by Specialist Peter Cestare to respond to 2 [REDACTED] Tibton Circle, Myrtle Beach in reference to a white male found by the newspaper delivery person, stabbed lying in the street in front of this residence. Specialist Peter Cestare also informed me that Detective Todd Cox was in route as the case agent. In addition Deputy Coroner Tamara Willard was also in route from the Coroner Office.

SEARCH WARRANT:

Search warrant was not needed due to outside public scene.

LOCATION DESCRIPTION:

Incident location was in front of 2 [REDACTED] Tibton Circle, Myrtle Beach SC 29588, which is located in the Palmetto Point housing subdivision located in the Myrtle Beach section of Horry County. The victim was found lying on his back in the roadway in front of this location with his head facing west and his feet pointing east. There was a vehicle parked west of the victim and a mailbox post to the left of the victim in the front yard of [REDACTED] Tibton Circle.

DETAILS/ OBSERVATIONS:

On the 18th day of May 2007 at 0618 hours I arrived on location at 2111 Tibton Circle to find the roadway taped off with yellow crime scene tape. The weather conditions at my time of arrival were over cast shies with clouds and a light breeze coming out of the east and a temperature in the mid 70's. I first began by taking overall photographs of the scene and then taking photographs of the roadway both east and west of the victim's location. I then began to take close up photographs of the victim to include his hands and feet. I took several close up photographs to show to the wounds to the chest along with some hairs that were located on both hands of the victim. I then photographed the black handled knife that was in the open position lying on the pavement to the right of the victim's right leg. I took several photographs of the knife with and without scale and then took several close up's of the hairs that were stuck in the locking area of the knife handle and blade.

After photographing the victim, I found some blood spatter on the mailbox post along with some blood on the door hinge of the mailbox. I photographed the blood spatter with and without scale. After photographing the blood spatter I collected several DNA blood swabs from the spatter and the blood on the door hinge.

After I had completed my photographs I took measurements of the scene using the front west edge of the garage at 2111 Tibton Circle and the front door at 2111 Tibton Circle. I took measurements of the victim along with placement of evidence that I had collected from the scene. I then began to take measurements of the victim's body to show its placement and where his hands and feet were in relation to the rest of this body.

After completing my measurements of the body and of the evidence, I collected the knife. I then collected a DNA swab from the blood pool that was near the victims right foot area. Once I had the evidence collected I then proceeded to roll the victim to get a look at his back. When I rolled the victim I did not see any lacerations or other wounds to the victim but I was able to recover a clear baggy with a white powder substance that fell out of the victims left pocket.

The victim was removed from the scene and transported to Grand Strand Regional Medical Center. With the victim removed, I took some general photographs of the area with out the victim and then conducted a final walk-through of the scene with Detective Todd Cox. I cleared the scene at 0800 hours and proceeded to Grand Strand Regional Medical Center to attend the autopsy.

At 0830 hours I arrived at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center to attend the autopsy of Michael Nicholas Vieira with Forensic Pathologist Doctor Edward Proctor. I began by taking overall general photographs of the victim from all angles to include the palms of the hands and also the tops and bottoms of the feet. I then processed the victim's hands for more hairs and also took latent prints from his left and right hand for possible comparison. I photographed the lacerations that were on the victim's upper chest and lower right abdominal area. I labeled each laceration with a number and then photographed each one with scale. I collected two purple top tubes of blood along with a gray top. I collected the victims clothing and cleared the autopsy at 0945 hours.

PHOTOGRAPHS TAKEN:

See attached photographic print index for a record of all photographs taken by this investigator relative to this incident. Photos were taken with a Nikon D100 digital camera using an 18 – 70 MM Nikon Zoom lens.

EVIDENCE COLLECTED:

Crime Scene:


EXAMINATIONS



August 18th marked the 12 week period since my son was found dead in Myrtle Beach. We still have not received any word from the Coroner, Pathologist, Toxicology, SLED Investigation, etc. This has been agonizing and only exasperated by the lack of information.

From our previous conversations, I know that you are under the belief that this was a "self inflicted" incident however, before I begin my own investigation, I need the above information. Unlike you, I do not believe the incident occurred as you surmise. I feel those present at that house have told conflicting stories regarding Michael's demeanor prior to his death, who supplied the drugs, etc., which leads me to believe there is more information to be gained thru these people. Although not admissable in court, I would like them to submit (or at least be asked) to a "black box" test.

I don't understand how all blood traces were gone from the scene because of rain (as you stated) but remained on the mailbox where my son was found.

Can you tell me if you used the "black light" to check for possible cleaned-up blood at the [REDACTED] Residence?

Further, I would like to know the results of your follow up conversation with [REDACTED] regarding my son's shoes. We discussed this on more than one occasion as you may recall.

This summarizes the telephone conversation I had with █████ while he was at your house last week.

I left a message this AM with the detective. Hopefully, he'll call back this AM. Basically, I wanted to share some of █████ statements (what is his real name? - I had it written down but can't find it).

Some of the things that conflicted with other's statements were:

The detective told my cousin █████ that according to "someone's" statement, that Michael had been confrontational all day. █████ claims quite the opposite. As a matter of fact, he said Michael was unusually quiet - not his "happy go lucky self". He said he wondered why. He said that after they arrived at █████ house (after 5PM?), █████ went and got Chinese Food - steak and shrimp specifically, and some "liquor". He said Michael and he ate the food and drank.

According to █████ at about 8:30PM █████ took what looked like a gold colored gel-like honey comb from his pocket and placed it on the table. This was the acid - Every one (Michael, █████, █████, █████) broke off and took 2 "honey combs" except for █████ who took 3-4, according to █████. █████ says no other drugs were used during the evening AFTER the acid was introduced. █████ also says that █████ statement to the police included the fact that he introduced the cocaine at the gathering.

The confrontation occurred after a friend of Michael's arrived █████. According to █████ arrived at 10:30PM... █████ stated that █████ caused a "wrench in the vibe" and asked him to leave. At this point, █████ said Michael was the one trying to calm HIM down - not the other way around.

Somewhere between the time that █████ left (approximately 10:30 PM) and Michaels' death, which according to the coroner was at 1:00AM, a confrontation did occurred between Michael and █████ (████ does not know these details because he and █████ were in the garage when when heard yelling in the house.)

████ claims he first entered the house thru the garage and gave Michael a "bear hug" from behind and tried to calm him. █████ followed into the house and got in front of Michael. When tried to break free from them, █████ slammed Michael to the floor and held him there. - This is quoted by █████. It was then that █████ called █████ Michael's wife. █████ received the call at 12:15 AM - She suggested they let Michael free and let him go outside, which they did. According to █████ they closed the garage door (which had been their access throughout the night) - apparently to keep Michael outside.

████ claims he watched Michael stand on the front lawn for quite some time from the house window. When he last looked, Michael was gone. He claims he went back out to the garage and opened they door so that Michael could get back into the house

████ is unsure about how much time has passed before █████ come outside and walked to the community swimming pool and then returned. I don't know where the pool is located in relation to her house.

████ then claims he went into the bedroom, where █████ was laying down on the bed. He says he went to sleep at about 5:30 AM and woke up after the police had arrived at the house.

He also claimed that more than likely Michael's shoes were in █████ house; that as a rule, they remove their shoes when entering the house. Apparently, Michael wasn't given the opportunity to put them back on before leaving or he just neglected to do so. If the group was trying to keep Michael out of the house, the fact that they shut the garage door indicates he may not have left willingly.

█ has offered to give his statements while attached to a lie detector -

On the morning of May 18, 2007 at approximately 6:45am I arrived on Tipton Circle in the Myrtle Beach section of Horry County to assist in the death investigation of a man who was later identified as Michael Vieira. I observed the victim, a white male, lying in the road on his back near the curb. He was directly in front of the mailbox at 2 Tipton Circle. The deceased was clothed in a pair of loose fitting blue jeans with a belt and his boxers were partially visible. He was not wearing a shirt or shoes and was only wearing one sock on his left foot. The deceased was also wearing a gold colored necklace and had multiple tattoos. His hairstyle was a Mohawk. A knife was on the roadway in close proximity to the deceased. I did observe numerous stab wounds on the right side of the deceased's stomach and numerous stab wounds in his chest area. There were no defensive wounds to the deceased's arms and/ or hands and there were no other injuries visible.

who was delivering papers for the Sun News, discovered the deceased in the roadway at approximately 5:30am, at which time he placed the call to 911. I obtained a tape-recorded statement from . He indicated that he had not seen any other persons in the area and had not noticed any other vehicles driving in the area. I also examined hands and arms and examined his clothing. There was no evidence that would indicate had anything to do with the death of the deceased. (See statement).

Following my interview with I assisted other detectives in conducting a neighborhood canvas for witnesses. I made contact with , at 2 Tipton Circle. The men indicated that they were in town on vacation and had been out enjoying bike week festivities before returning to Tipton Circle at approximately 3:30am. None of the aforementioned persons reported hearing or seeing any kind of disturbance. There was no evidence of involvement in the incident.

I also met with the residents who were living at 2 Tipton Circle. They were identified as

██████████. HCPD Victim's Advocate, Min Alexander, assisted with the Spanish translation. The residents at 2 ██████ had not heard or seen any disturbance in the neighborhood.

At approximately 8:30am, I attended Vieira's autopsy at GSRMC. Dr. Proctor performed the procedure. CSI. Deal also attended the autopsy. Vieira's clothing and property were taken as evidence to include an orange, plastic container that was in his right front pants pocket. There was a white powdery substance in the container. In addition to other evidence collection individual scaled photographs of each stab wound were taken. There were a total of twenty-six wounds. Upon completion of the procedure Dr. Proctor advised that the preliminary cause of death was several stab wounds to the heart. (See autopsy report).

Later that afternoon I accompanied Det. Cox to 4 ██████ Harthside Drive, located in Summerville, SC where we met with and obtained a tape-recorded statement from the deceased's wife, ██████████ (See tape-recorded statement).

On May 18, 2007, I received a phone call from Sgt. J. Brantly, Horry County Police Department Violent Crimes Division Supervisor, alerting me of a body that was found in the roadway near 2 [REDACTED] Tipton Circle, in the Palmetto Glenn subdivision. I told Sgt. Brantly I would be responding to the scene.

I arrived at the incident location at approximately 07:15 AM. I began by interviewing the residents of 2 [REDACTED] Tipton Circle, who advised that they had rented the house for Harley weekend. I first spoke with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that he and his friends had been out drinking all night and made their last stop at the Waffle House on Hwy. 544. [REDACTED] states that after leaving the Waffle House, he and his friends drove back to their rental house and went to sleep for the night. [REDACTED] stated that he didn't see anything unusual and defiantly not a body lying in the road, when they came home.

I next spoke with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated he was the designated driver for the members of the rental house, for last night's activities. [REDACTED] stated that he drove the men to several bars and they made their last stop at the Waffle House on Hwy. 544. [REDACTED] stated that

they left the restaurant at about 03:00AM and got home at about 03:30. [REDACTED] stated he backed the truck into the driveway and all parties exited the truck and went into the house. [REDACTED] states that he didn't see a body in the road near the rental house and didn't notice anything suspicious.

While looking at Vieira's body, patrol officers gave word that the residents of 2 [REDACTED] Tipton Circle were missing one of their friends. I went down to the house and there met with homeowners [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Accompanying [REDACTED] [REDACTED] were friends [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] began by saying that one of their friends, Michael Nicholas Vieira, 4 [REDACTED] Hearthside Dr. Summerville, SC [REDACTED], had come up with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] from the Charleston area, to spend the weekend and bike ride with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I asked [REDACTED] now accompanied by [REDACTED] if Michael had an ID in their house. [REDACTED] stated he would go see. I walked back to their home and waited outside. [REDACTED] came out a few minutes later and gave me a backpack that he stated contained everything that Michael had brought to his home. I looked through the bag and on top was a black leather Harley Wallet. I opened the wallet and found a SCDL with Michael's name inside. I copied this information and began to talk with Michael's friends. Sgt. Brantly handed me a picture that Crime Scene personnel had taken of the deceased's face. I took [REDACTED] aside and showed him this picture, which he identified as Michael.

I first met with [REDACTED] who stated that Michael had brought approximately 20 "hits" of acid with him, 2 grams of cocaine, and all parties had a small personal bag of marijuana. [REDACTED] stated that Michael started to "freak out" shortly after taking the acid. [REDACTED] stated that he and [REDACTED] had to physically restrain Michael several times because he was "tearing [REDACTED] house up". I asked [REDACTED] what he meant by "freaking out". [REDACTED] stated that Michael was being very aggressive and he feared that Michael was going to hurt one of them. [REDACTED] stated that Michael was talking about Jesus and speaking in tongues while he was in this state of mind. I asked [REDACTED] how much acid Michael had

taken. [REDACTED] stated that all parties did all the acid and cocaine last night while drinking heavily. [REDACTED] then added that while restraining Michael, Michael had punched him in the nose and scratched [REDACTED] several times. [REDACTED] revealed that he was still under the influence of acid while he stated these things to me.

Det. T. Large had begun to interview [REDACTED] in the house while I took a statement from [REDACTED] on the front porch of the home. I obtained Consent to Search from [REDACTED]. After interviewing these people, detectives were told that we needed to bring them back to the police department to be interviewed. I transported [REDACTED] back to the police department. I'm not sure how the others got back to the M.L. Brown Building.

[REDACTED] was placed into interview room #1. I began the interview by stating to [REDACTED] that I record all my interviews and [REDACTED] stated he needed to tell me something. [REDACTED] in a spontaneous utterance, stated that Michael had called a man named [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] house to sell him some cocaine. [REDACTED] stated that when [REDACTED] arrived on a "decked out" full dress Harley Davidson motorcycle, they all thought he was a police officer because of his mannerisms and the way he was dressed. [REDACTED] stated that none of the people at the house, except for Michael, knew this man and because they were all "trippin" him showing up "ruined the vibe". [REDACTED] stated that they all wanted [REDACTED] to leave and [REDACTED] eventually told him to go. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was very upset by this and cursed all the people at the house as he left on his motorcycle. [REDACTED] stated that after [REDACTED] left they all began to yell at Michael for bringing [REDACTED] into their group. [REDACTED] went onto state that Michael began to get very mad at them for being mad at him. [REDACTED] stated that he and [REDACTED] went to the garage and continued to smoke marijuana and drink alcohol while [REDACTED] all stayed in the house. After a few minutes, [REDACTED] stated he heard a loud commotion coming from the inside of the house and he and [REDACTED] ran inside, from the garage, to see what was going on. [REDACTED] stated that when he entered the house, [REDACTED] was "nagging" Michael about bringing [REDACTED] to her house. [REDACTED] stated that Michael began to yell and curse at her and to physically intimidate her by posturing himself towards her and screaming at her. [REDACTED] stated that he pulled Michael back from [REDACTED] and Michael punched him in the nose. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] jumped in and together they physically restrained Michael. [REDACTED] stated that he tried to "talk Michael

Down” and when he thought Michael was coming around, they would let him go. [REDACTED] stated that after letting Michael go, he “went back into his bad trip” and they would have to restrain him again. [REDACTED] stated that this went on over and over until, eventually, he was too tired to keep doing it. [REDACTED] stated that at some point, Michael’s wife, [REDACTED] was on Michael’s phone but Michael wouldn’t talk with her. [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] who was on the phone with [REDACTED] asked what they should do. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] told them to let Michael, “walk it off”, which they did. [REDACTED] was Mirandized and he waived his rights stating he had told me everything already and had nothing to hide. [REDACTED] was emotional about the entire ordeal but still lucid enough to give a statement. [REDACTED] also told me that he didn’t know if Michael was “going through a homo phase”. I asked him what he meant. [REDACTED] stated that Michael had become “very touchy feely” around the other guys. [REDACTED] stated that during one of Michael’s “freak outs” last night, he thought he heard Michael say, “God, I’m not gay”. I asked [REDACTED] about Michael’s relationship with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated it was the same as everyone else’s. [REDACTED] stated that it wasn’t uncommon Michael to get on his motorcycle and be gone all night if he was upset. The interview was recorded on VHS Video Tape and Cassette tape.

I next interviewed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was Mirandized and he also waived his rights. [REDACTED] stated that everything was fine till [REDACTED] arrived. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was “an asshole” and put everyone on edge. [REDACTED] stated that after [REDACTED] left, everyone was mad at Michael for bringing him around. [REDACTED] stated that he and [REDACTED] went to [REDACTED] garage and were hanging out there when they heard a loud noise from inside. [REDACTED] stated that he and [REDACTED] ran inside and found Michael yelling and cursing at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated he didn’t know why though. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] pulled Michael away from [REDACTED] and when he did, Michael struck [REDACTED] in the face. [REDACTED] stated he jumped in between the two because he didn’t want to see his friends fight. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] tried to calm Michael down but Michael was just yelling incomprehensible things and praying. I asked [REDACTED] about the homosexual comment that [REDACTED] had mentioned. [REDACTED] smiled and stated that last night, Michael wanted to show him something in his room. [REDACTED] stated that he had his hand on Michael’s back and Michael stated, “I’m no fucking homo”. I then asked [REDACTED] what kind of person Michael was. [REDACTED] became very emotional and cried stating that Michael was a good person. I asked [REDACTED] if Michael was easily upset. [REDACTED] stated that Michael was always the first person to get mad or upset. [REDACTED] described him as a “fire cracker”. I

asked [REDACTED] about the phone call to Michael's wife [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated that at some point between "freak outs", Michael called [REDACTED] on his cell phone but wouldn't talk with her. [REDACTED] stated that he was standing next to Michael when this was going on and [REDACTED] was trying to restrain Michael again. [REDACTED] stated that he took the phone and asked [REDACTED] what they should do. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] stated to "just let him walk it off". [REDACTED] stated that he was frustrated and screamed to everyone to let Michael go. [REDACTED] stated Michael walked out the front door and they didn't see him again. This interview was recorded on VHS Video tape and audiocassette.
