Upon hearing further from the parties and by mutual agreement of the parties, the Court finds and **ORDERS** as follows:

1. The Horry County Police Department shall transport all hair follicle samples collected during the autopsy of Scott Spivey on September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023, to the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) for forensic examination and testing.
2. Such biological samples shall be handled in a manner that preserves the chain of custody, ensuring proper documentation and secure transfer.
3. Upon receiving and examining the sample, SLED shall notify the parties whether any of the material is testable and detail the methods or procedures that will be used for testing.
4. SLED is hereby **ORDERED** to facilitate forensic testing in as expeditious a manner as possible to prevent any further delay in these proceedings, consistent with practicable and standard forensic protocols, if any testable material is identified.
5. All parties to this litigation shall be provided access to the results of any testing facilitated by SLED and shall be furnished with a complete case file of those results.

This order supersedes and amends the Court's previous order dated July 15th, 2025.
